

iPad Workshop Notes

iPad 101

- Pressing the 'Home' button at any time will take you back to the main home screen. Alternatively, the five-finger pinch will take you back to the same screen.
- If you swipe to the left from the main home screen you will find the search screen. This is a great way to find apps quickly.
- The volume can be adjusted in two ways-either using the 'Multi-Tasking Bar' or the switch on the side. The mute switch on the side shows a red dot when it is on.
- Pressing the 'sleep' button and the 'home' button at the same time will take a screenshot of the screen and put the photo on the Camera Roll. This is useful for quickly saving work which is finished or saving websites for offline use.
- Quickly tapping the 'Home' button twice will bring up the 'Multi-Tasking Bar'. Alternatively, a four-finger swipe up will also bring this up.
- The 'Multi-Tasking Bar' can be used inside any app to quickly swap between apps, adjust volume or to access 'Airplay'.



General Settings

- Go here to add a passcode lock
- Accessibility-Assistive Touch-Shortcut button on screen.
- Accessibility-Guided Access-Limits access to a certain app.
- Accessibility-Speak Selection-Speak selected text. Can also change option such as dialect, speaking rate and highlighting words as they are spoken.
- Siri-only available to iPad 3, New Generation and iPad Mini. Turn on in General Settings-Siri-Siri On. Change the language to English (Australia). Once it is set up, press and hold the 'Home' button to activate Siri.
