Welcome back to everyone in the Kōrakonui community for 2024. We start this year with 147 students. We hope you've all enjoyed a wonderful summer break. It is always exciting to welcome our students back to



school, hearing about all their great summer adventures and seeing how much they've grown! Our year started with our Mihi Whakatau to welcome our new staff and students to Kōrakonui School. This is always a special event and it was lovely to see more whānau coming along to be a part of this.

This term we have many exciting events planned for our students including swimming lessons, swim safety lessons at the Ōtorohanga pools, our school and inter school swimming sports, the EPro8 engineering/ technology competition, the Colour Run, camp for our Year 5-6 students at the Ngāruawāhia Christian Camp, and of course our exciting classroom programmes. Our learning programmes focus on developing well rounded, engaged and happy students who are supported to be the best they can be, and ready for the exciting challenges and journeys they're heading towards in the future.

This term has started extremely well with many exciting initiatives and opportunities available. Thanks to the dedication of our amazing staff and the unwavering support from our wider community, Korakonui School continues to be a hub of engaging activities and learning opportunities for our students.

We really appreciate the amazing support we have received from whānau and the wider community for our events thus far. There was a great turn out for the Junior Swimming display last Friday. It was lovely to see extended family coming along and supporting our junior students. Our swim safety sessions in Ōtorohanga also received great support with transport, supervision and assistance in the pool, making these experiences that much more successful.

Over the summer we had a significant amount of property work happening. The exterior of the junior block was repainted, and the interior of Te Kawa and Mangatutu classes repainted. New doors were installed for Lethbridge, Mangatutu and Te Kawa classes and vents were installed into the pool changing shed doors, to improve air flow. A shelter was installed for the Lethbridge class cloak bay area to ensure the students' bags are protected from the weather. New cubby holes were installed for the students of Wharepuhunga and Mangawhio classes to keep their bags well sheltered, we had a new office built next to Mangatutu class for our Learning Support Coordinator, a new pump shed was built and lastly the senior toilet block was completely remodelled. It is great to see our school looking so fresh and inviting. We are currently working on an upgrade to our water system which will involve installing a new water tank, replacing old pipes and water lines, upgrading our filtering system and replacing our school bore. Most of this work will happen in the next school holidays, which we hope will cause minimal disruption to the staff and students.

We're looking forward to a fantastic 2024 school year and look forward to sharing our many successes with you. Ngā mihi nui,
