Our Before School Programme

The Korakonui Kickstart programme will occur for the 4 weeks leading up to each child's 5th birthday, or entry to school. These sessions run on Friday mornings from 9am-10am and are based within Te Kawa class. This programme is designed to help the children prepare for school, to allow them to build relationships with the teaching staff, and their fellow students, as well as their older peers within Mangatutu class.

If you are interested in your child taking part in this programme, please contact the school office or our Principal, who will be able to give additional information.

Please note: Korakonui School does not have cohort entry. Learners can start from 5 years old.



Kōrakonui School **Stock Scheme**

Here at Kōrakonui School, we run a stock scheme as our major fundraising initiative. This money allows us to provide the best possible education for the kids in our community. We would like to express our sincere gratitude to everyone who's contributed to our stock scheme. To our donators, graziers, co-ordinators, your support makes a significant difference for the opportunities our students can reach.

How does it work? We ask of our farming families, for a kind donation of a weaned beef calf or grazing for these animals. Alternatively, proceeds from bobby calves or culled animals are welcomed. Donated calves are collected by the Stock Scheme Committee volunteers in November and relocated to grazing, through to maturity.
