Dear Kōrakonui Community

This term began with sunshine and a special whakatau to welcome new students and their families. These occasions are always a highlight, marking the beginning of new journeys within our kura/school and setting the tone for a positive term ahead.



Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC) this term! Our Year 5 and 6 students travelled to Auckland where they explored the science of flight at MOTAT, followed by an unforgettable overnight stay at Kelly Tarlton's Aquarium, where they slept beneath the glow of the tanks and marine life. It was a magical learning experience that blended science, adventure, and memory-making. Thank you to Miss Powell, Mrs Gera, and the parents that supported the event to make it happen!

Our relationship with Whakamarama Marae has also continued to grow and flourish. Following the meaningful visit by our senior students last term, this term it was the turn of our junior students, supported by Bayley Class, to enjoy the same experience. These visits provide a wonderful way for our tamariki/children to deepen their understanding of pōhwiri while building cultural connections that will last well beyond the classroom. Looking forward, we are aiming to have a Kapa Haka performance at the marae in Term 4.

A group of our students enjoyed a Sailability Day at Lake Ngāroto, where they had the chance to learn the basics of yachting. The day was as much about teamwork and problem-solving as it was about sailing, and our tamariki/children embraced the challenge with enthusiasm.

Sport in Term 3! Our annual cross country, hosted on the Ralph family farm, challenged students to push themselves while supporting one another to the finish line. Congratulations to Hunter McGillivray and



Jeuan Palaganas, who won our senior boy and senior girl cross-country trophies. Those who qualified went on to represent our kura at the Lower Waipā Cross Country, where we were proud to celebrate a number of top 10 finishers. A special mention goes to Louis Dorssers, who placed first in the 12-year-old boys' event.

Last week, our Year 7 and 8 Bayley Class joined forces with Kio Kio School to attend the five-day Sports Camp at Tōtara Springs. Students competed in more than 30 activities ranging from highly competitive sports to new challenges designed to test teamwork and resilience. The week was capped off with a special highlight – winning the prized Cheer Trophy, awarded for a five-minute choreographed dance routine. A huge thank you goes to Mel from Ōtorohanga Dance Company for her creativity, energy, and dedication in preparing the performance. Our gratitude also extends to Jude Stacey, Gerard Dorssers, Alana Phillips, and Emma Telfer, whose tireless efforts before and during the camp helped make the week such a success. We can all be proud of the way our Korākanui students represented their kura and embraced the opportunity to connect with others.

Another point of pride has been the arrival of our new school sports jackets, generously supported by the Kōrakonui Hall Committee. Thank you to the hall committee! These jackets were worn for the first time at

Sports Camp and looked absolutely fantastic on our tamariki. Keep an eye out for these at our next sports event.

Community Spirit in Action. Our kura once again marked Daffodil



Day, with students dressing in yellow and green, purchasing cupcakes, and making donations in support of the Cancer Society. Together

we raised over \$200, with additional contributions made online. This generosity reflects the caring spirit of our community and the willingness to get behind causes that touch many families.

The strength of our community has also been visible in the support shown across events this term. From parents and volunteers marshalling at cross country, to providing kai/food at marae visits, to filling in where ever help was needed, these contributions have been invaluable in creating memorable experiences for our students.

Teacher Growth, Leadership, and Sustainability. Professional growth has been a strong focus in Term 3. Our staff took part in a Teacher Only Day dedicated to the revised New Zealand Maths Curriculum, ensuring that our teaching practices remain fresh, effective, and in line with new approaches.

Meanwhile, our six House Leaders took part in a leadership development day with Sport Waikato, where they learned practical ways to guide games and activities. These skills have already been put into action as they have led age-appropriate activities for each of the classes in our school. Well done to our House Leaders for the energy and leadership they've shown.

This term has also seen the **Garden to Table** programme thrive under the guidance of Ruthie Gera, who has brought passion and creativity to this project. Different classes have used produce from our school gardens, as well as contributions from local gardens, to create wonderful meals each week. To support this, we have planted three new kōwhai trees and a collection of new fruit trees, which will continue to fuel both learning and sustainability for years to come.

Board of Trustees Update. We have recently completed the Triennial Board Elections voting process and are delighted to announce our Board of Trustees. This group of committed community members will help guide the direction and success of our kura in the years ahead. The re-elected trustees are Cynthia Port and Kate MacDonald. The newly elected trustee is Simon Fookes, and our Staff Representative is Fraser Quinn. It's also important to thank Gerard Dorssers for his contribution to the school board over the past 6 years and to Lisa Leather, for her term as our Staff Representative. We thank all candidates who put their names forward and look forward to the contribution this Board will make.

Staffing Update. We would like to wish Heather Cork all the best as she goes on maternity leave to welcome her second child into the world, and to wish Lewis Morgan every success as he pursues his love of early childhood education. Looking ahead to Term 4, Mrs Alana Phillips will be teaching in our Mangatūtū classroom, and Ms Ana Cornish will be teaching in our Lethbridge classroom. Looking Ahead. As we look ahead to Term 4, we warmly welcome back Tom Cochrane into the role of Principal, as Fraser Quinn steps down from the Acting Principal position he has held throughout Term 3 whilst Mr Cochrane has been on sabbatical.

A reminder too that on Wednesday 8 October, the very first Wednesday back in Term 4, we will hold our annual Agricultural Day. This is a traditional and proud component of our school calendar, and we warmly invite everyone in the community to come along and show their support.

Stock Scheme 2025/26 - Thank you in advance, to those who have reserved and are rearing a beef calf donation at present. One of our team will be contacting you over the next few weeks, to confirm and then plan a pick up for early November. If you are new to our area and would like to donate to our school stock scheme or could offer grazing, please contact James or Simon.

How does it work? We ask of our farming families, for a kind donation of a weaned beef calf or grazing for these animals. Alternatively, proceeds from bobby calves or culled animals are welcomed. Donated calves are collected by the Stock Scheme Committee volunteers in November and relocated to grazing, through to maturity. If you are able to be a part of our successful stock scheme programme, please contact our stock scheme co-ordinators.


